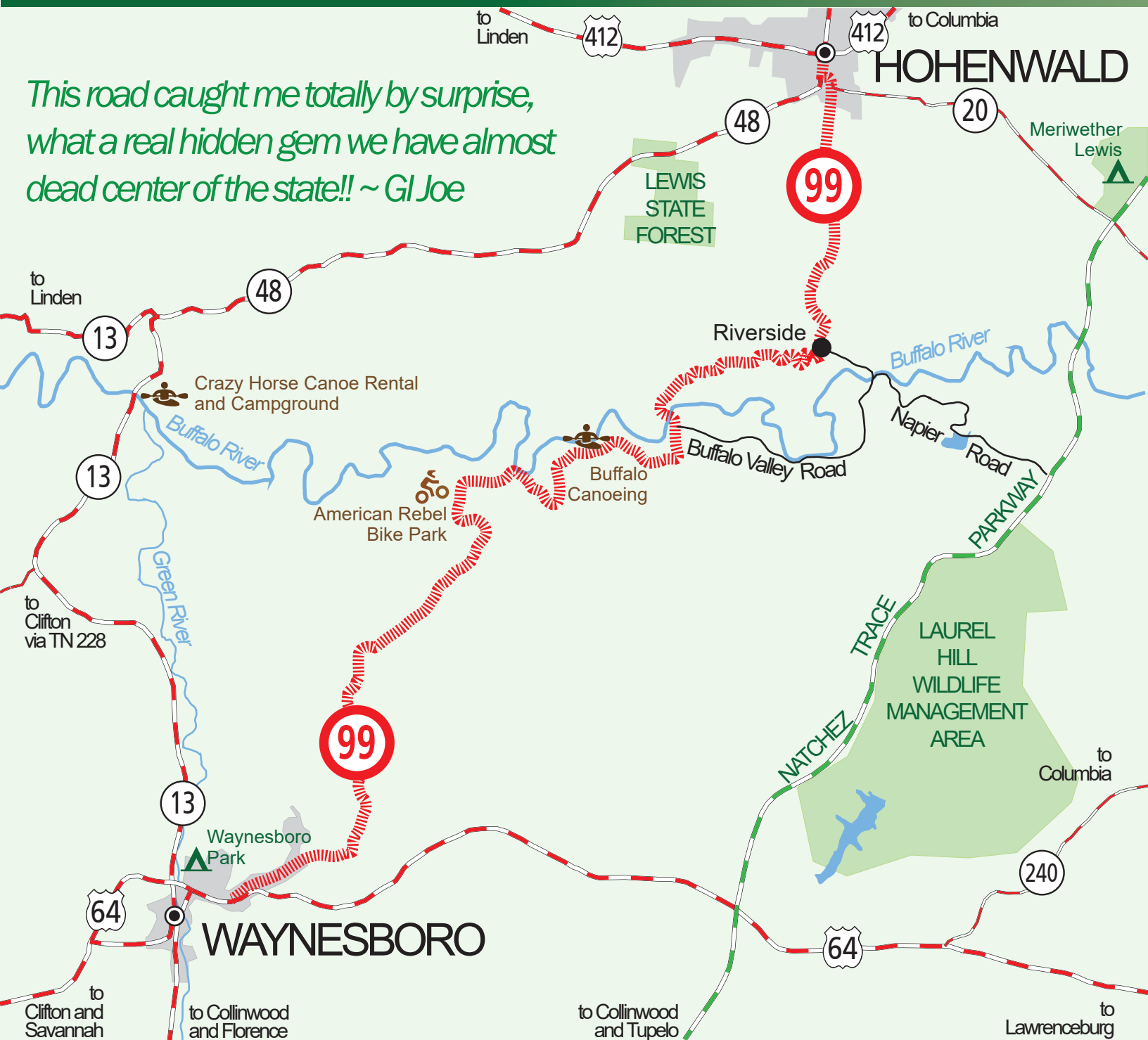


NINETY-NINE ON NINETY NINE

NINETY-NINE ON NINETY-NINE

Middle Tennessee's Ultimate Ride runs 28 miles through the Western Highland Rim from Hohenwald to Waynesboro. You'll encounter 99 sweeping curves over this white-knuckle road, and enjoy superb scenery including a beautiful stretch along the Buffalo Scenic River. There are no billboards and little traffic along the route, just excitement you won't find elsewhere in Middle Tennessee. *Do you have what it takes to handle the ninety-nine on Ninety-Nine?*

Road Notes

The 28-mile motorcycle tour begins in downtown Hohenwald at the intersection of US 412 and TN 99, and runs 28 miles south and southwest to the junction with US 64 in Waynesboro. The two-lane highway is recently paved and has a low traffic volume. Elevations begin at 968' in Hohenwald, drops to 616' at the Buffalo River, and climbs to 955' before dropping to Waynesboro at 700'. Opportunities for legal passing are best near the ends of the route, which a few straight stretches along the Buffalo River.

Return Options

Riders have a couple of interesting options to consider for the return trip to Hohenwald.

- Tennessee Highway 13 leads north from Waynesboro, traveling along the Green River and climbing fast to a junction with TN 48 at Flatwoods. From there, follow TN 48 generally east and northeast through the Lewis State Forest to Hohenwald. Total distance: 28.1 miles.
- Another option is to ride east from Waynesboro for 7 miles on US 64, then take the beautiful Natchez Trace Parkway northbound for 27.6 miles to Tennessee 20 at Meriwether Lewis Park (free camping), then west for 7 miles to Hohenwald. Wonderful scenery and no commercial traffic, but be mindful of the 50 mph speed limit! Total distance: 34.6 miles.

Other interesting options include a loop off TN 99 along Buffalo Road, and the challenging Napier Road to the Natchez Trace, both shown on the map.

Trip Planner

HOHENWALD (Mile 0)

- County seat of Lewis County. Lewis County Museum of Natural History, Elephant Discovery Museum, Strand Art Gallery, Meriwether Lewis Park (7 miles east). All amenities, including gas, food and lodging.

RIVERSIDE (Mile 12.9)

- Gateway to the Buffalo Scenic River valley. Market and gas.

BUFFALO RIVER (Mile 10.2)

- Popular stream for canoeing, kayaking and smallmouth bass fishing.

BUFFALO CANOEING (Mile 6)

- Boat rentals and quiet family campground.

AMERICAN REBEL BIKE PARK (Mile 16.7)

- Extensive park open for scheduled group rides, includes miles of challenging off-road trails, camping, and Buffalo River access. 931 722-5058.

WAYNESBORO (Mile 28)

- County seat of Wayne County. Wayne County Museum of Musical Heritage, Stage 64, Waynesboro City Park (camping).

ON TENNESSEE 13

- Crazy Horse Recreational Park, boat rentals, two campgrounds. 931 722-5213.

ON NATCHEZ TRACE PARKWAY

- Meriwether Lewis Park. Area interprets the untimely death of the famed explorer who is buried here. Picnic area, hiking trails, and free campground.
